We built lots of connections and five Anna Chaplains signed up to partner with us on the day for our special offer and unique PAYG system. We are excited to see how this works going forward.

Broadmead Community Church in Northampton signed their partnership agreement at the end of November and have received their partner journey, and access to the training so that they can launch their group at the beginning of February.

Vicky has also contacted several Diocese leads and has a few meetings booked for the new year, as well as one in December with the lead for Bath & Wells. Feedback has been good, and people are interested to find out how they can work with TBT further.

Sophie who goes to Aucklands care home received a message from one of the staff – 'We love having you all attend it has literally had such an impact on the beautiful residents. Always full of cheer and cuteness!'

Jill witnessed this lovely moment of interaction - We had the song wind the bobbin up and one of our props was my grandmothers copper thimble, the lady that opened the bag in which it was in, is very crippled and bent over. But she insisted on standing up and trying to walk over to the children to show them. Her husband who was visiting was so pleased and teary.



TBT ESOL

We have completed our TBT ESOL pilot and are now looking at what the next steps are for this project. It has been wonderful to be able to partner with International Care Network (ICN) as we have delivered the groups. There has been lots of interaction and engagement.

November Highlights:

After the session, at the beginning of the ESOL class, perhaps half of the women wearing their 'I am heard' stickers. Asking one of them, Fatma, to say what her sticker said. She told that class something like, 'I am hear', and then we looked together and read it. I asked her, what does this mean? Then she pointed upward and said 'God', then pointed to her ear 'hears', then pointed toward herself, 'me'.

Nearly all women involved in holding parachute, and a lovely peaceful atmosphere to laugh and be together in, with music, 'Yes Jesus loves me, the Bible tells me so.' A place of safety and assurance being built.

As we think about next steps, we have been meeting with our organisations to discuss possible partnerships and ways that we can reach this isolated community. We are also applying for some grant funding as most people attending this group would not be able to pay anything to attend.

We look forward to sharing with you how this develops in the new year.
