NEW PARTNER CHURCHES

St Georges Church in Hereford have been the first to complete our training using the app with the videos that we all recorded earlier this year. The training app was well received and easy for them to use. They will launch their first group session at the end of November. Citygate are multiplying and expand their reach, launching a second group at the Avon Cliff care home on the 13th November.

We are continuing in discussions with Exeter Diocese who are very keen to partner in the future. We are currently working on some bespoke taster sessions for them in the new year.

Gemma and Vicky will be attending the Anna Chaplains conference on the 9th November to discuss TBT in further detail taking some of our lovely handmade bags with them to offer the opportunity to partner with us on a unique PAYG system.

Vicky also has an exciting opportunity to speak with the Methodist Church's Intergenerational and Family Officer about how we may be able to work together in the future.

TBT ESOL



On the 31st of this month we have launched our first ESOL pilot project. Karen Priest, our pilot co-ordinator, has been preparing resources and gathering participants to attend this group. It will be running every week between now and the Christmas break. Our hope is that, through this project, we will give confidence to those attending, enabling to engage more in their local community as well as enjoying learning something about how they are loved by God.



There were 21 people in attendance and the feedback has been that all those who attended were well engaged and enjoyed the session. We will be running five more sessions this term with the hope to make this an additional service that TBT offers.
